Cats on the Page, British Library

Lewis Carroll's personal copy of an early edition of Through the Looking Glass and Judith Kerr's original illustrations for her world-famous story Mog the Forgetful Cat are two of the standout highlights at the British Museum's feline-inspired exhibition, <u>Cats on the Page (https://www.bl.uk/events/cats-on-the-page)</u>.

Through a collection of artwork, sound recordings, letters and old manuscripts, Cats on the Page explores the myriad ways in which these majestic creatures have been depicted by writers in literature from the 16th century to the modern day.

Birmingham Christmas Market

Soak up the festive vibes at Birmingham's Frankfurt Christmas Market $\underline{\text{($https://visitbirmingham.com/whats-on/birmingham-frankfurt-christmas-market-p1323321)}, the \ biggest$ German market outside of Germany and Austria. Running until 23 December, the market offers up a bevy of Bavarian-inspired delicacies such as bratwurst to glühwein, as well as hundreds of twinkly huts selling handcrafted gifts, live music and interactive workshops.

Christmas at Kew Gardens

See a different side of London's Kew Gardens (http://www.kew.org/kew-gardens/whats-on/christmas-at-kew), one of the largest botanical gardens in the world, by visiting its annual festive trail of lights. This year, the event - which is on from the end of November until early January - features a new Laser Garden installation as well as Firework Trees and a Cathedral of Light. Be sure to catch the 300 illuminated origami boats by Italian artists Aether & Hemera that will light up Kew's lake, and end your walk with some mulled wine or spiced cider to get you into the Christmas spirit.

The Clock, Tate Modern (1 - 2 December)

Get down to <u>Tate Modern (https://www.tate.org.uk/whats-on/tate-modern/exhibition/christian-marclay-clock/christian-marclay-clock)</u> on the first weeke of December for the last 24-hour screening of Christian Marclay's ingenious film installation The Clock. From 10am Saturday to 10am Sunday you'll t able to experience the virtual timepiece, which is made up of thousands of film clips and perfectly synced to real time. Entry is free but based on a first come, first-served basis, so expect queues, but rest assured it's worth every second, minute and hour you can spare.

Google Curiosity Rooms

For the second year running, <u>Google (https://events.withgoogle.com/curiosityrooms/)</u>, will host a series of inspirational workshops, talks, pop-up stores and immersive dining experiences in a three-storey space in Piccadilly. Events are free to attend and celebrity hosts include Pixie Geldof, who will be talking about her wardrobe in collaboration with British Vogue, Professor Green and Jessie Ware. Guests must register online in advance.

Edinburgh's Hogmanay (30 Dec-1 Jan)

Bring in 2019 at <u>Hogmanay (https://www.edinburghshogmanay.com/)</u>, a festive fusion of live music, traditional ceilidhs, food, drink and fireworks. Alongside the annual torchlight procession and street party, this year's Concert in the Gardens will be headlined by Scottish indie fivesome Franz Ferdinand. On 1 January, round off the celebrations with a plunge into the freezing Firth of Forth for Edinburgh's New Year's Day tradition, the Loony Dook.



Expect classic improv games and plenty of audience participation as host Clive Anderson is joined by a star-studded cast of comedians, including Colin Mochrie and Josie Lawrence.

Home Futures, Design Museum

Go back to the future with the Design Museum's illuminating new show, which explores today's home through the eyes of innovative 20th-century architects and designers.
